



125 high school freshman and sophomore students from three school districts in Cass County attended the Connect the Dots program on the Cass County Fairgrounds.

Corrine is one of the freshmen students who attended Connect the Dots. “I had so much fun being able to learn about what all might go into farm management. I also had fun looking at different jobs I thought I might be interested in.” 28 local business and organizational leaders volunteered their time to talk to students about career opportunities. “One of my favorite parts of the day was when we got to get up and go ask [volunteers] a power question.” Corrine said she enjoyed learning from the volunteers as they shared the experiences they’ve had that shaped their professional lives so far.
