2014 Beef Weigh Day

4-H exhibitors who plan to show beef in 2014 at the Adams County Fair, Nebraska State Fair or Ak-Sar-Ben must have their beef animals (Market, including 2nd Year Bucket Calves, and Carcass) weighed and tagged. The Adams County Beef weigh day is scheduled for **Saturday, January 11, from 11:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m.** The weigh day will be held at the Animal Clinic, W. Highway 6 and Marion Road. There is a \$1.00 charge per ear tag. All animals that are headed to State Fair or

Ak-Sar-Ben must have DNA samples taken this day. The charge to collect hair samples for State Fair and Ak-Sar-Ben bound cattle is \$6.00 per animal. Please note this is the only date to DNA identify market beef. It is important that you do not schedule veterinary services during the weigh-in; please make other arrangements with the Animal Clinic for your veterinary services. Please note: as a rule change you may weigh in another county prior to the January 11th Adams County weigh day but you will forfeit your participation in the Adams County Rate of Gain Contest.

- **America's Farmers Grow Ag Leaders Scholarship**

The Monsanto Company recently announced the launch of America's Farmers Grow Ag Leaders, a \$1,500 college scholarship for students pursuing degrees in agriculture-related fields. Please spread the word about this scholarship opportunity to eligible students by sharing this information with 4-H leaders in your area.

The application period runs November 15, 2013 - February 1, 2014. The application is administered through the National FFA Scholarship program, but students do not need to be a member of FFA to apply. The application can be found at FFA.org/scholarships. Applicants will need to obtain the endorsement of three farmers. The endorsement period runs from November 15, 2013 – February 8, 2014. Farmers can endorse applications at FFA.org/scholarships or by calling 1-877-267-3332.

FCS America Project Loans

Farm Credit Services of America will also help students to obtain financing for up to \$2500 for 4-H and FFA production projects that will be repaid within an annual production cycle, including such things as feeder pigs, feeder calves, and feeder lambs. For those of you interested in starting a breeding herd, individual student breeding livestock loans, up to \$10,205, offer future producers first-hand experience in business planning and farm financing. Other types of projects will also be considered. **Scholarships:** They also will be giving scholarships of \$2,000 to qualified college juniors and seniors and will offer \$500 annual scholarships to qualified freshman and sophomore students studying agriculture or Ag business at land grant colleges in our area. Rural Youth Loans

As you begin looking for your project for next year, you may want to consider an opportunity that is available to you. The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farm Service Agency makes operating loans of up to \$5,000 to eligible individuals between the ages of 10-20 to finance income producing, agriculture-related projects. The individual must be participating in 4-H, FFA, or a similar organization. The program must be planned and supervised with the assistance of the organization's supervisor and the individual's parent or guardian. This assistance will help the individual to produce a sufficient income to repay the loan, and provide the youth with practical business and educational experience in agriculture-related skills. The loan funds may be used to purchase livestock, feed, seed, equipment, and supplies for the project. They may also be used to buy, rent, or repair needed tools or equipment. Rural Youth Loans have a maximum loan amount of \$5,000 (total principal balance owed at any one time on the loan) and the term can range from one to seven years. After the loan is made the interest rate will not change for the entire term of the loan. A parental signature is required on the application for the loan, but not on the promissory note or the other documents used to secure the loan. 
FIRST LEGO League (FLL)

FLL is designed for youth aged 9-14. Teams work to design, build and program a LEGO NXT robot to solve missions using models built out of LEGO's. They also research and prepare a presentation addressing a real-world issue related to the annual theme and prepare to share their core values and leadership skills with judges. This year's annual theme, Nature's Fury, focuses on weather events and natural disasters. Nearly 1,000 Nebraska youth will compete on an FLL team this season statewide.

Selecting your Calf for Beef Weigh Day

Let's do some figuring to determine the appropriate target weight for Beef Weigh Day on Saturday, January 11th. First count the number of days between the January Weigh Day and the July Weigh Day. That number is 185 days. If you want to gain at least 2.5 lbs per day and assuming a county fair weight of 1,300 lbs then the biggest calf you want to bring to January Beef Weigh Day is 837.5 lbs. That was figured by: Target Weight – (Number of Days * Average Daily Gain) = Beginning Weigh Date Weight 1,300 – (185*2.5) = 837.5 lbs. You may want to adjust this weight if you have a higher Average Daily Gain or want a smaller animal so you can continue on to State Fair. Please take a moment to determine what size of calf you should bring to January Beef Weigh Day. Also, if you plan on using a different animal for State Fair than what is at County Fair, it still must be weighed and DNA identified on January Beef Weigh Day. Best of Luck figuring your calculations and selecting your calf or calves!

4-H Stampede

The 2014 4-H Stampede date has been set! The 2014 4-H Stampede has been scheduled for Saturday, March 1, 2014 and entries due to the Adams County office by Friday, January 31st 2014. So, mark your calendars!!



New for 2014: there is now an option of having a **Junior Horse Bowl Team** and a **Senior Horse Bowl Team** at Stampede. Senior Teams can have Juniors on the team, but the team will not be eligible for Nationals. Seniors on any team will have to compete at a Senior Level. There will be a \$10.00 entry fee per team member and a maximum entry fee of \$40.00 per Horse Bowl Team, 5th team members and alternates are free.

Horsin' Around 2014

Tommy Sheets will headline the 22nd annual "Horsin' Around" conference Feb. 8-9 in the RB Warren Arena at the Animal Science Complex on the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's East Campus. Sheets is a professional All-Around-Horseman from New Albany, Ind. He has been in the horse business most of his life, with many World Champions, Reserve World Champions and 40 Congress wins on his resume. He was the 1996 American Quarter Horse GMC Sr. All-Around Champion with Zippos LTD and 2007 AQHA Sooner Jr. All-Around Champion with Good for the Ladys. He has 15 total AQHA National Honor Roll Champion's titles in western pleasure, reining, western riding and trail and performance halter. He has earned over 7,000 AQHA points and has been a six time AQHA Team Wrangler Member. "This will be his first trip to Nebraska," Anderson said. "And he brings to Horsin' Around his unique, detailed and precise methods to produce top horses and riders for a multitude of events." Also speaking at the event will be equine extension specialist Lena Cottle and extension horse specialist Kathy Anderson. The conference begins at 9 a.m. both days and is open to participants of all ages. Adult registration is \$30 for both days or \$20 for one day. For youth 18 and under, the cost is \$20 for both days or \$15 for one day. If the clinic doesn't sell out, registration will be available at the door for adults at \$40 for both days and \$25 for one day and for youth at \$30 for both days and \$20 for one day. No phone-in registrations are accepted.
