Dear Master Gardeners:



DIRECTIONS FOR NORFOLK GARDEN TOUR August 8, 2017: Beginning at 6:00 p.m.

√ *First Garden: Betty Stoley, 208 Shetland Path*

Drive east on Benjamin Ave to Hwy 35. Drive east over the new highway to the old highway. Turn left and follow old highway to the Shell Station. Turn right at the Shell Station. Follow left after the gas station and pass the SID building. Shetland Path is the first road on the left. Stoley house is the fourth house on the right. (If you are coming from the North, turn left at the Shell Station in Woodland Park!)

√ <u>Second Garden: Donna Andrew, 1403 Valli Hi Road, 6:30 ish</u>

Take Highway 35 south back to Benjamin Ave. Turn west (right). Turn right on to Valli Hi Road. Valli Hi is before the roundabout at 25th St. House is on the left.

√ *Third Garden: Marsha Eckert, 2207 Clearfield Drive, 7:00 ish*

Drive north on Valli Hi Road to Clearfield Drive. Turn right on Clearfield. House is on the right.

√ <u>Fourth Garden: Sheila Schukei, 2701 Dover Drive 7:30 ish</u>

Head west on Clearfield Drive. Turn right on 25th Street. Turn left on Dover Drive. House is on the corner of Dover and East Berry Hill Drive.

Drive west on Dover Drive to Hackberry Drive, turn left. House is on the left. Please feel free to park in the driveway.
