All youth involved in 4-H must be enrolled by June 15th in order to participate in the County and State Fair this summer. There is an enrollment fee of \$10.00 per youth, \$20.00 per family. #### **State Fair**

#### Livestock Nomination on Show Stock Manager https://showstockmgr.com/

Starting in 2023, all livestock in contention to exhibit at the Nebraska State Fair will be required to submit a DNA nomination. This includes all 4-H and FFA breeding livestock, market livestock, and feeder calves. Any DNA nomination submitted through Show Stock Manager will also be eligible for exhibition at the Aksarben Stock Show. DNA nominations will be \$7.00 per animal. All animals will automatically be eligible for both breeding and market-no additional fees or double payments will be required. DNA nominations for the Nebraska State Fair are due on June 15, 2023.

#### State 4H Competition Age Change

New this year! All members who are at least 9 years of age on January 1st will be eligible to participate in 4-H in-person events (live animal shows, fashion shows, and contests) at the Nebraska State Fair. This does NOT apply to horse events.

## Horse Exhibitor Levels

To ensure the safety of all horse exhibitors and spectrators, it is REQUIRED for ALL youth to pass the Beginning Horseman: Level One testing. This level is designed for riders who have little or no experience around horses. It emphasizes correct and safe handling and riding principles and should help develop the members' confidence concerning their ability to ride and guide a horse. The rider's balance, correct seat and use of hands' should be stressed.

Youth, 13 years old and up, need to complete Level 2. Work with your horse leaders to complete this certification. Resources are available to study at http://4h.unl.edu/horse

## CULLINARY CHALLENGE





#### **LIVESTOCK AUCTION**

The livestock auction will again be online due to the success of last year. Pictures will be taken of your animals **PRIOR** to the sale. Details in July newsletter.

#### **GENERATORS**

Generators will be allowed in 2023 because of the lack of electrical output in the west Quonset that is needed for beef blowers and fans. Those who normally groom their cattle in the west Quonset will have the option to bring in a generator to be used in the Quonset. The generator must be an inverter type to reduce the noise competition with arena speakers. Those who want to bring a generator will need to claim a permit from the extension office by July 1. The permit must be attached to the generator and will be checked by Beef Superintendents and 4-H and Extension Staff. There will be 5 permits that are available first come, first serve, limit 1 permit per 4-H family. Generators must be placed outside the Quonset on the north side, between the Quonset and bucket calf / small animal barn.

#### Swine Ear-Tags

Fillmore 4-H will continue the identification process as a visual tag for county fair. An E-ID is also acceptable, as that is required for State Fair.

To identify your hogs, stop in the office to pick up your tags. They must be in hogs by June 15th.

All ear tags not matching ID sheets will NOT be allowed to participate in the 4-H show; they will be allowed to

participate in the open class show.

#### **Breeding Gilt**

Breeding gilts' birth date should be on ID form turned into Extension Office by June 15th.

#### **Breeding Sheep**

Remember that to show in a specific breed class, registration papers are required and must be owned by the exhibitor or immediate family.

#### Home Born and Raised Animals

Remember to declare all animals that are Home Born and Raised on the livestock ID sheets. This must be done with all beef, sheep and swine exhibits if you want your animals

recognized as such.

#### **Breeding Beef Tattoos**

Remember to have all breeding beef animals properly tattooed by June 15th. Tattoos will be checked at fair check-in. Also, to show in a specific breed class, registration papers are required and must be owned by the exhibitor or immediate

family. Please make sure livestock pre-entry forms are properly filled out to ensure breeding animals are in correct

class.


#### Bucket Calf Record Books.

Educational displays and public relations are also an important component of Herdsmanship.
