-Think about projects or exhibits your 4-Her is going to want to do. Look at the previous year's fairbook to get an idea of the projects available.



Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 8 to 21 with a focus on three core pillars: food safety, animal wellbeing, and character development. This training is required for all food producing animal or livestock project members. Food producing and livestock projects include beef, sheep, swine, dairy cattle, dairy goat, meat goat, poultry and rabbit. Members will go to www.yqca.org and log in using their 4HOnline login. Members must have an Active status with 4HOnline to be able to log in and complete the courses.
