- Does your project show long-term impact? One time experiences, travel, etc. are not the goal of this grant. Quality materials and training experiences that lead to years of enhanced programming are favorable options.
- Avoid requesting funds for community service projects that are conducted by 4-H groups, but don't directly impact 4-H members and families. Organizing a club fundraiser to support such a project would be more appropriate.
- Plan to include youth at the presentation to the Foundation Board we love to hear from them!

*Applications should be received no later than <u>Monday, April 8, 2024</u>. Applicants are asked to meet with the Foundation at the annual meeting around April 9th at the Extension Office. Applicants will be contacted with an appointment time, starting at 7:30 pm CT. Please email or hand-deliver your application to the following address:
