Rules

- 1. Must be age 5-7 and signed up in the Clover Kid Project as of Jan 1.
- **2.** Each Clover Kid may exhibit 6 static age-appropriate entries reflective of regular 4-H project topics. Examples of Clover Kid curricula includes: Just Outside the Door, Aerospace, Theater Arts, A Space For Me, Bicycle Adventures, Making Food for Me, Clover Kid Create It, Animal Caretaker, Family Celebrations Around the World, and Sewing for Fun.
- 3. Each Clover Kid may exhibit one entry per type of allowed animal species at the fair.
- **4.** Clover Kids do go through the interview judging process.
- **5.** Each Clover Kid will receive a participation ribbon.

Rules for Clover Kids Companion Animal Show & Tell

- 1. An opportunity for Clover Kids to "show" their small pets will be held during the 4-H Companion Animal Show. If youth have attended dog practice, they may choose to show their animal at the 4-H Dog Show vs. the Small Animal Show & Tell.
- 2. Youth must be able to handle (keep under control) their pets while they visit with the judge.
- **3.** Examples include dogs, cats, guinea pigs, pet rabbits, poultry, etc.
- **4.** Dogs and cats must be exhibited on a leash.
- **5.** All animals should be in secure cages or carriers when not being shown.
- **6.** All health rules for Dogs and Companion Animals must be followed, including submitting proof of vaccination at the time the pre-entry forms are submitted.
- **7.** Cherry County 4-H Companion Animal pre-entry forms must be submitted by the deadline indicated on the form.
- **8.** Adult assistance is encouraged.
- **9.** Any animal under 350 lbs. lamb, goat, bucket calf, hog, etc. is allowed. This animal can be borrowed from an enrolled 4-H member.
