

The purpose of the 4-H Foundation is to act as an integral support system of 4-H programs and youth in Cherry County. The goal of the foundation is to develop leadership and to stimulate interest in lifelong learning, while encouraging the betterment of Cherry County and its communities. Funds generated by the Cherry County 4-H Foundation are to be used for adult and youth training, program development and acquisition of equipment to benefit 4-H and youth. The applications will be due March 4 by 4:30 pm if dropping off at the office, or midnight if e-mailing to mgarwood3@unl.edu. Please contact Michelle for a copy of the grant application.

Youth Project Grants & Club Grants - Applications Available March 15

Each year, the Cherry Co. 4-H Council provides project grants for individual 4-H members who are in need of funds to help support their learning efforts for the year. The youth completes an application and must report on their grant project with a poster display at Achievement Night in September. They are also encouraged to attend a 4-H Council meeting in the fall to share as well. Some examples of how grants have been utilized in the past (grants are intended to supplement funds the 4-H member is supplying, not usually the entire cost of the project): archery equipment, livestock supplies (waterers, huts, show halters, etc.), support for purchasing livestock, sewing machines, partial camp scholarships, etc. Clubs are also able to apply for grants to help with recruitment, activities, service projects, etc. The applications will be available on March 15, after the March Council meeting where the budget will be set and grant dollar amounts will be determined. Grant applications will be available under "Project Resources" on the Cherry Co. 4-H website and will be due April 15, 2022.


