Enroll for CWF 2023 OR 2025!

The Cherry Co. Citizenship Washington Focus (CWF) trip scheduled to depart in the summer of 2022 has been postponed until the summer of 2023 due to complex COVID regulations. That means, registration for CWF is opening up NOW in 2 WAYS:

- 1. Any youth who will be at least 14 years old by approximately June 1, 2023, is welcome to register for the 2023 trip.
- 2. We are sticking to our regular future schedule, so the next cohort will still start forming for 2025 this spring/summer. Any youth who be at least 14 years of age by approximately June 1, 2025, may register for that trip and start fundraising now.

Youth Project Grants & Club Grants DUE May 23

Each year, the Cherry Co. 4-H Council provides project grants for individual 4-H members who are in need of funds to help support their learning efforts for the year. The youth completes an application and must report on their grant project with a poster display at Achievement Night in September. They are also encouraged to attend a 4-H Council meeting in the fall to share. Some examples of how grants have been utilized in the past (grants are intended to supplement funds the 4-H member is supplying, not usually the entire cost of the project): archery equipment, livestock supplies (waterers, huts, show halters, etc.), support for purchasing livestock, sewing machines, partial camp scholarships, etc. Clubs are also able to apply for grants to help with recruitment, activities, service projects, etc. The applications are due May 23, electronically or via drop-off at the Extension Office.

Livestock Requirements and Deadlines

Please carefully read the livestock section of the 2022 Premium book!

Important deadlines:

June 1 - ALL LIVESTOCK ID FORMS due to Extension Office. Please upload <u>here</u> or drop off in-person. (We are trying to move away from

receiving these via e-mail, FB messenger or texting, please.) Also, for MARKET BEEF, MARKET SHEEP, MARKET GOATS, AND MARKET SWINE, we need to receive a photo of each animal on your ID sheet that clearly shows the 4-H tag number in the animal's ear. (Stocker Feeder photos are not due until the last Friday in July, use ranch numbers on ID forms.) The photos should be uploaded to the same site as the I.D. forms. *There is a grace period until June 15, but a \$10 late fee per ID form will be charged.*

June 15 - Final day to enroll in 4-H and drop/add projects to be eligible for 2022 County and State Fairs.

June 15 - State Fair Livestock Nominations due. It is highly recommended to nominate prior to the due date in case you encounter technical difficulties!!!

July 15 - Proof of YQCA completion due (online or in-person) along with all pre-fair entry forms.







NEW Platform for YQCA in 2022

Every year, youth enrolled in livestock projects (including rabbit and poultry) must complete Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) training. In March, the training moved to a new platform. If you plan to complete YQCA training online, go to <u>YQCAProgram.org</u>.

The Nebraska 4-H Premier Animal Science Event (PASE) features a variety of state-level animal science contests. The two-day event is designed to help youth explore issues related to the animal industry, discover college and career opportunities, and work with other teens from across the state. Youth have the opportunity to participate in <u>livestock judging, meats judging</u>, and <u>poultry judging</u> contests, as well as <u>livestock skill-a-thon</u> and <u>livestock quiz bowl</u>. Youth can participate in more than one contest or event as their schedule allows. In addition, youth will have chances to explore East Campus, meet with faculty members and current college students, and have fun with friends! PASE is held annually at the University of Nebraska–Lincoln East Campus. This year's event will be held **June 22-23, 2022**.

Nebraska 4-H Livestock Achievement Program

This additional opportunity for enrolled livestock project youth, is designed to promote all educational aspects of 4-H livestock projects including selection, production, leadership, and exhibition by recognizing youth striving to improve in their livestock project knowledge and leadership.

The program recognizes Members of Excellence across all 4-H livestock project areas, including: beef, sheep, meat goat, swine, dairy cattle, dairy goat, rabbit, and poultry.

The program consists of two levels that require 4-H members to plan and report a broad range of ageappropriate and project-related accomplishments. For each level, the Livestock Achievement Program provides a list of accomplishments from which 4-H members choose their goals. Each accomplishment is worth a specific number of points. Intermediates, ages 10-13, must complete 100 points worth of activities to receive the distinction of Intermediate Member of Excellence. Seniors, ages 14-18, must complete 150 points worth of activities to receive the distinction of Senior Member of Excellence. The Plan and Reports, linked on the webpage, show examples of the project related accomplishments they can choose, or they can identify their own with approval of their local educator.

Applications/Sign up are due June 15th through the application form link on the website. Plan and Reports, as well as Project Records will be due August 10 via the completion form on the website. 



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State Horticulture Judging Contest (Online) June 3-20

Do you know what it takes to pick the best fruit and vegetables out at the grocery store? Or do you know what judges are looking for when they judge your plants at the county fair? Have you ever wondered, what plant is that!?! We are excited to offer the opportunity to learn these and



other important horticulture skills through the Online Horticulture Contest. The contest will be available June 3-20, 2022 at: <u>https://go.unl.edu/online4hhortcontest</u>


Horticulture judging contest consists of three parts. The first is identification of plant material. Participants identify the plants by common name from a plant list. Specimens may be alive or preserved plant parts like stems, twigs, leaves, flowers, seeds, fruits, roots, bulbs, tubers, or plant products.

The encound is a low sould do a monthly in the forms of a torus (folds or moultime a bairs out)

Questions will test the contestant's knowledge of cultural practices for horticultural crops, plant science, pesticides, horticultural careers and other topics related to the production, processing and consumption of horticultural crops.

The last portion is judging or placings. This is where four different plants, plates of vegetables, or containers flowers are ranked from best to worst based on a set of criteria. Classes are judged on the basis of condition, quality, uniformity, true-to-type, and size.
