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Living over 450 miles away from Omaha, where special science-focused youth programs are held regularly, Dru, a five-year Cheyenne County 4-H member, was able to participate in the Biomedical Engineering Camp when it came offered virtually this year. Dru wants to be a neurosurgeon when he grows up, and he wanted something to keep him busy during the summer, since many of his other activities weren't offered due to COVID-19. In the process, he engaged in hands-on activities by simulating surgery with a laparoscopic camera, experimenting with pill coatings, designing a prosthetic leg, building a 3-D skeleton in TinkerCAD, and much more.
