

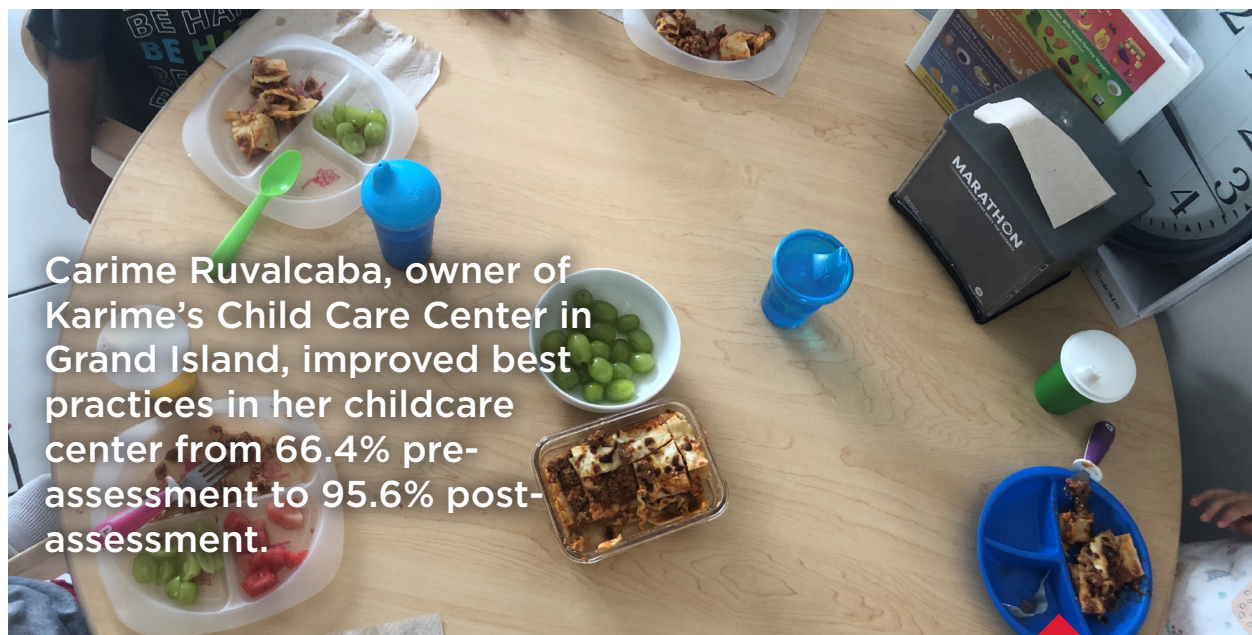

Carime Ruvalcaba, owner of Karime's Child Care Center in Grand Island, improved best practices in her childcare center from 66.4% pre-assessment to 95.6% post-assessment.

Quality childcare is an essential component of a flourishing community. Carime Ruvalcaba, the owner of Karime's Child Care, took part in the Go NAP SACC process to increase positive child outcomes within her center. A major improvement was starting family-style dining. It involves sitting at the same table with young children in small groups, with the children serving themselves. Carime states, "It is in my heart to provide the best care I can to help them be ready for preschool".

Programs At-A-Glance

- iGrow @Home, a virtual 4-H activity resource, was provided to all Hall County Elementary Schools, reaching over 5,500 youth and their families.
- Land Management Workshop: 24 producers representing 14,000 acres of crop/forage/grazing lands received valuable information on land leases, farm transitions, and cash rent values.

100 latino entrepreneurs came together for the first Latino Small Business Conference.

810 6-8th graders engaged in hands-on learning with STEM classroom kits.

1300 people engaged in Nutrition Education Program lessons for limited-resource families.
