

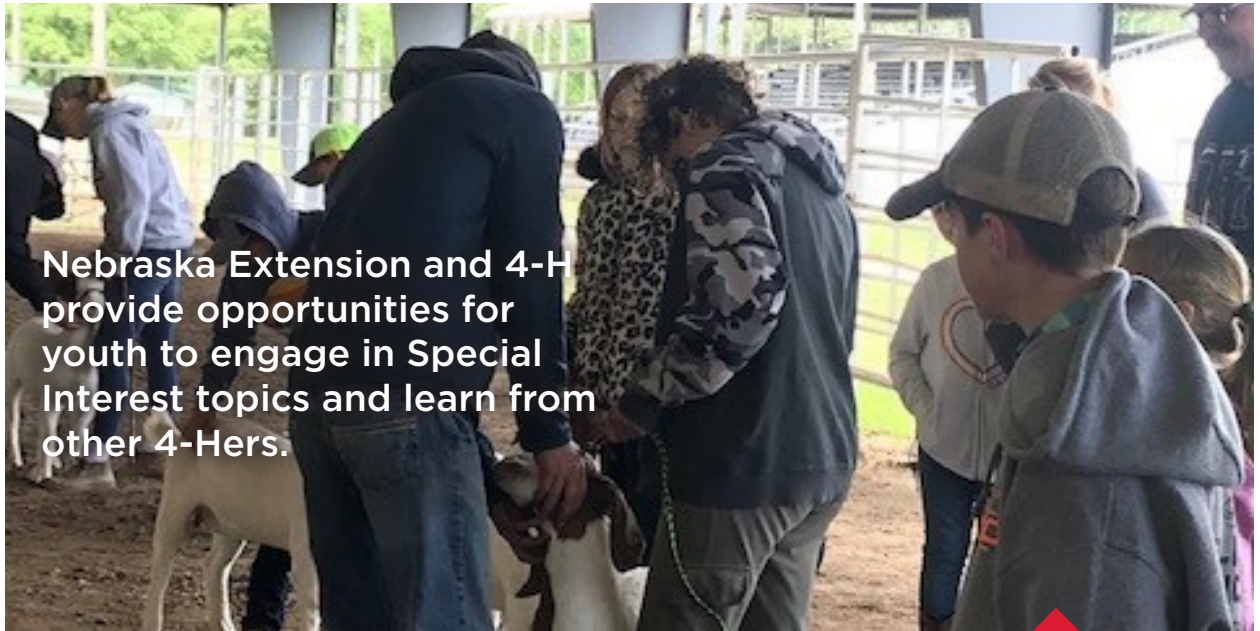

2021 Impact At-A-Glance



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Nebraska Extension and 4-H provide opportunities for youth to engage in Special Interest topics and learn from other 4-Hers.

54% of Johnson County 4-Hers who show livestock attended one of the Clinics put on this spring. Each clinic was taught by 4-H Alumni. The clinicians focused on the initial training and daily care of the animal then gave tips and pointers on clipping and showing. The youth had an opportunity to bring their animals and get one on one help. Dakota Andrews was happy to have this opportunity, she learned a lot of new things and might even want to show sheep next year. Learning from 4-H Alumni shows the long-term impact this program can have. Johnson County had 100% participation in Showmanship.

Programs At-A-Glance

- In partnership with the State Budget Administrator, Rural Prosperity Nebraska Educators assisted Elk Creek and Crab Orchard to secure \$11,504 from the American Rescue Plan Act.
- Innovative Cropping and Water Systems Educator provided Private Pesticide Application Training to 35 community members who needed recertification.
