Lane Meyer has learned about the benefits of cover crops & soil health on their integrated crop/ livestock operation. The past 6 years Extension has worked with Lane and his father Ron, monitoring their use of cover crops and the impact on soil health on their farm. “The field days, workshops, & farm tours focusing on cover crops/soil health has been very beneficial for our farming operation. Collecting data from our farm has demonstrated how cover crops are improving our soil & providing grazing for our cattle. We have evaluated cover crops & learned from other farmers about cover crops.”

Programs At-A-Glance

- 109 farmers attended agricultural meetings in Nemaha County to learn about pesticide safety, agronomic practices, cover crops, soil health, farm management, and on-farm research.
- Extension provided assistance to Auburn stakeholders wanting to chart a new course for positive change. New visions and goals have begun to emerge for their community.

89 Nemaha County youth were reached through the Extension After-School Program.

≈100% of 5th graders in Nemaha County received entrepreneurship Extension school enrichment programming.
