## 2021 Impact At-A-Glance



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50 plus school enrichment program opportunities support students in all grades by expanding school curricula. School Enrichment programs impacted 49% of area youth in 2021.

Imagine walking into the restroom and hearing a Kindergartner singing “We wash our hands to keep them clean, the cleanest hands you’ve ever seen. Use soap and water, that’s the way to wash those yucky germs away,” the song you taught her three months prior while teaching FightBac to her class. It’s an awesome feeling to know that what you do on a daily basis is impacting students by changing their daily behaviors. A school board member from HTRS said, “The best part about partnering with Extension is it gives students a chance to do activities they may not be able to with normal curriculum.”

### Programs At-A-Glance

- 4-H Grows: 68% of age eligible youth were reached by clubs, special interest, school enrichment, workshops, and events; all to promote youth development, confidence, and leadership.
- NEW Programs: A 4-H project exploration school enrichment class was started in Falls City Middle School to allow students the opportunity to experience 4-H programs and projects.

**270** hours of school enrichment programming impacted students.

**23** producers were trained as private pesticide applicators.

**8** participants completed the Leading Locally program taught by Extension.
