

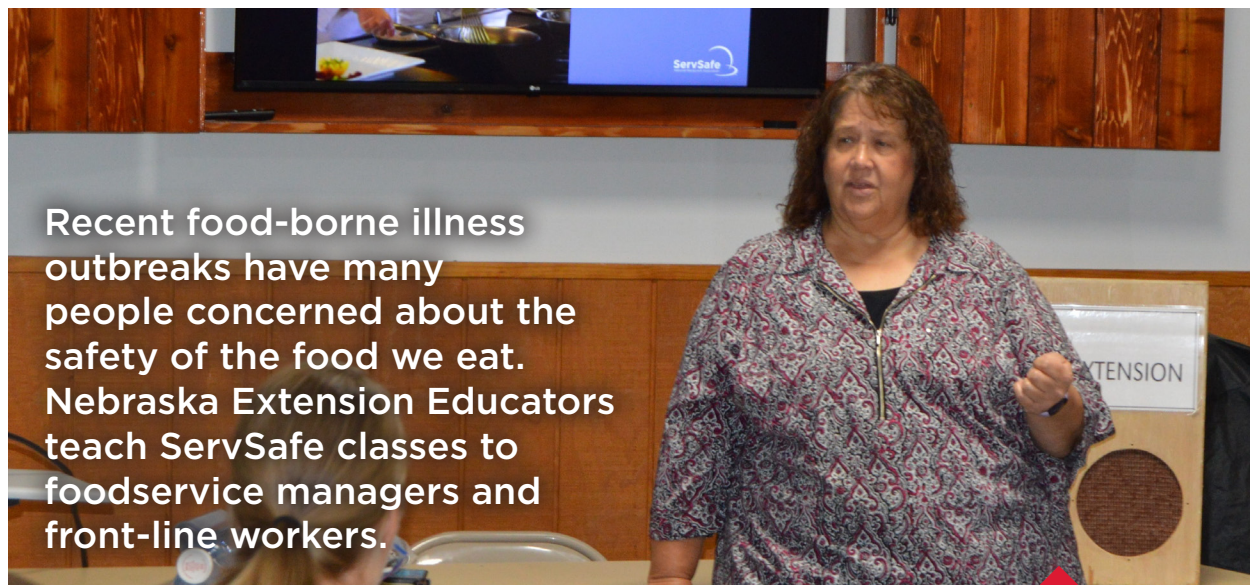

2021 Impact At-A-Glance



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Recent food-borne illness outbreaks have many people concerned about the safety of the food we eat. Nebraska Extension Educators teach ServSafe classes to foodservice managers and front-line workers.

Essential food safety practices and a culture of food safety are taught and reinforced in ServSafe classes so Nebraskans can be assured their food is safe to eat. Schools, Senior Centers, Nursing Homes, and businesses in Dundy, Hayes, and Hitchcock Counties have sent food service managers and front-line workers to one of the ServSafe classes offered by Nebraska Extension in West Central Nebraska. A front-line worker that took a class in McCook stated, “will be taking everything I learned today and using it at both my jobs.”

Programs At-A-Glance

- Healthy Habits Days were held in Southwest Nebraska teaching hands-on Food, Nutrition, and Health topics to nearly 400 5th and 6th-grade students in seven counties.
- Nebraska 4-H Next Chapter is a college-readiness program that helps students prepare for and succeed in college by providing the skills needed to reach their academic goals. 80 students from 2 schools participated in the program.
