A Sheridan County Robotics Team practices STEM learning and exploration through exciting hands-on experiences inspiring them to experiment and grow their critical thinking, coding, and design skills.

The idea of using wearable sensors to create a jersey to help blind youth play sports secured a Sheridan County 4-H Robotics team the Global Innovation Award last year. This concept was put forward as part of the 2021 First Lego League 4-H competition. The team shared their idea with Nebraska Special Olympics staff about a future possibility. This year the team is preparing to defend the award by combining the idea of wearable sensors and using a GPS sensor to help mail carriers find the package they need for faster delivery at each location. Competition takes place in January in Sidney.
