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213 York County Fourth graders attended the third annual AG Festival. Youth from diverse backgrounds got to experience and learn about the basic concepts of Nebraska Ag Production.

Agricultural is the heart of Nebraska. As the state's leading industry, the impact goes far beyond the food supply, providing jobs, significantly contributing to the state's economy, and touching the lives of citizens every day. The goal of the field day experiences was to introduce students to the basic's concepts of Ag Productions. Students were immersed in agriculture through 25-minute, interactive sessions regarding a number of ag-related topics. The youth also learned how many careers can be connected to the ag industry and the significance of agricultural to the state.

Programs At-A-Glance

- **Food, Nutrition and Health:** 131 York H.S. freshmen learned the importance of healthy eating using the Husker Performance curriculum, focusing on nutrition for sport and health.
- Extension reached 625 youth in 35 classrooms with their Fight Bac! Handwashing program. The program shared proper handwashing techniques and how to reduce the spread of germs.
