Hunger affects 650 people in Antelope County. To help combat hunger, produce was grown in the community donation garden and donated to those in need.

The Antelope County Food Pantry is open the first and third Thursdays every month providing a vital resource of safe and nutritious foods to those who experience financial hardship.

At the end of the 2022 growing season, a pantry client wanted us to know how vital the donation garden and produce donations were to her. She stated: “The donated produce helped feed my family this summer. It is especially helpful in making ends meet for a big family.”

Programs At-A-Glance

- Partnership with 4 local libraries brought the Summer Reading Program to over 90 Antelope County youth.
- 68% of 4-H age eligible youth were reached via school enrichment activities, clubs, after-school programs, and camps.
