

# Chase & Perkins Counties Impact At-A-Glance

Through an ongoing partnership between Nebraska Extension and Chase County Schools, the Connecting the Dots College and Career Success program was delivered twice in 2022, allowing all Chase County Schools students enrolled in grades 9-12 to develop the skills needed for personal growth and success following high school. Youth made connections with local employers as well as military and college recruiters. As a 10th grade student noted, “Through talking to the employers, I learned the difference between an architect and a manufacturer. I now have a better idea of what I want to do.”

## Programs At-A-Glance

- **Healthy Habits Day:** 100% of the 5th and 6th grade students from Chase County Schools and Wauneta-Palisade schools learned how to make healthy food choices.
- **Ag Safety Day:** Through the Ag Safety Day, sponsored by Chase County 4-H, 100% of Chase County Youth, grades K-6 learn how to be safe at home and on the farm.
