

# Clay County Impact At-A-Glance



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Clay County Extension has reached 94% of youth, ages 5-18, through 4-H, school enrichment, shooting sports and after school programs. Among those youth are 151 active 4-H members.

The impact that 4-H has had on Marshall's life has been nothing but positive. He has learned responsibility and dedication to put forth the work that is needed to achieve favorable results. 4-H has also taught him patience when working with his sheep. His sheep flock has grown immensely, and he is now able to give back to younger kids and does his best to inspire them. ## Programs At-A-Glance

- Cow/Calf College participants managed over 2,000 head of cattle & 10,120 acres of rangeland or hay land, and indicated a potential impact of over \$132,000 due to knowledge gained.
- 97% of students who participated in College & Career Readiness Program stated it helped them to identify things that they are good at & 97% said it also helped them explore future.
