

# Gage County Impact At-A-Glance



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1 in 3 K-12 youth were reached by 4-H programming in Gage County. Youth developed life skills, built relationships with caring adults, and learned by doing.

148 K-6 youth from four counties participated in 4-H camps. Through hands-on activities, youth excelled in academics, gained interpersonal and decision-making skills, and built self-esteem. Learning opportunities in STEM, conservation and wildlife, outdoor skills, service learning, creative arts, healthy living, and shooting sports were provided. Six partnering agencies enriched the camp experience for youth. One partner stated: “4-H provided a wonderful opportunity for children to have a camp experience. For some, it was their first experience, and every child left with a huge smile.”

## Programs At-A-Glance

- Yard and Garden, a live call-in radio show, was broadcast to 4500 listeners for 20 weeks. 58% of listeners indicated the show led them to decrease their water and pesticide usage.
- ProHort, a program for green industry professionals, was well-received. One attendee commented: “My lawn care staff] keep talking about how awesome it was a week later.”
