

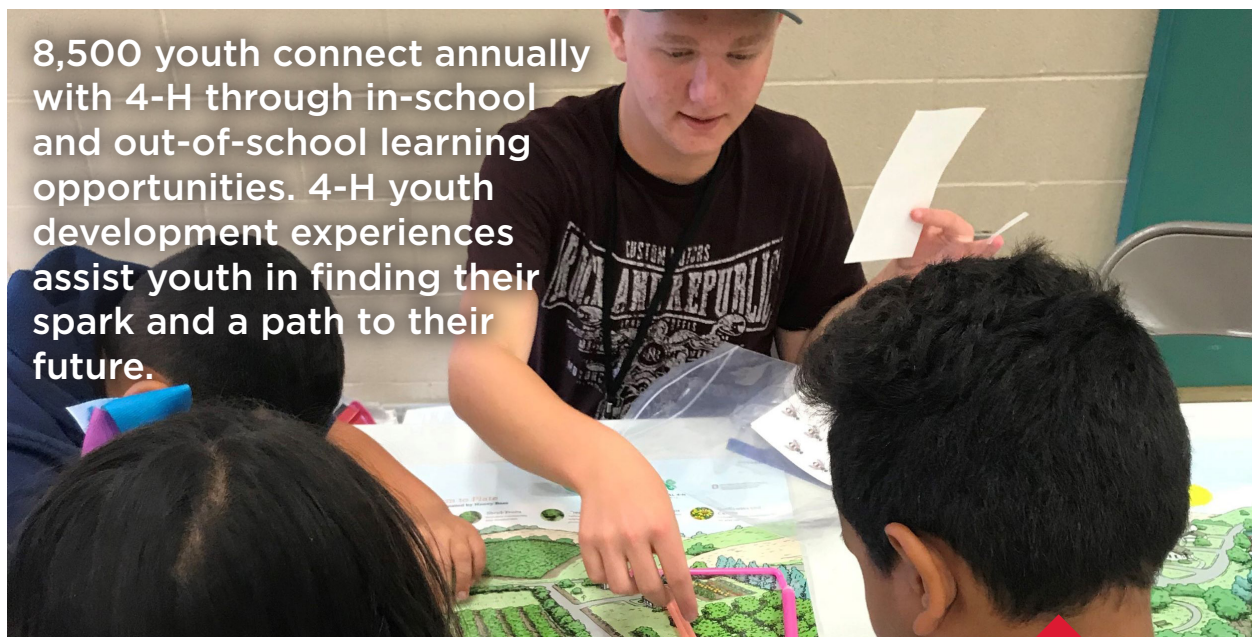

8,500 youth connect annually with 4-H through in-school and out-of-school learning opportunities. 4-H youth development experiences assist youth in finding their spark and a path to their future.

Conner Scholz discovered his spark for teaching through 4-H. His 4-H career evolved from a six-year-old showing poultry and beef, into leadership and teaching roles such as 4-H Council, fair superintendent, pollinator ambassador, 4-H Extension Intern, and an internship at the State 4-H office as a first-generation college student. ### Programs At-A-Glance

- Growing Together Nebraska Donation Garden: 10,221 servings of fresh fruits and vegetables were donated to local agencies who assist 1,321 individuals in Hall County.
- Cultivating Healthy Intentional, Mindful, Educators (CHIME): 11 childcare teachers were provided 176 hours of education on how to incorporate mindfulness into their lessons.
