Nebraska is the only state with a statewide 4-H Quilts of Valor effort, making quilts to thank and honor soldiers and veterans. The Quilts are to be given as an award to active military personnel and/or veterans of all branches of service; all ages; all genders.

Programs At-A-Glance
