Impact At-A-Glance



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Webster County youth explored the science of animals and where their food comes from through hands-on workshops.



Fifty-eight 4th grade students from Webster County schools attended the Animals Inside and Out program. Animal Science topics ranged from digestion and nutrition to reproductive systems and career opportunities. A favorite activity included reaching inside the rumen of a fistulated steer. 81% of surveyed students reported a better understanding where their food comes from. Additionally, 86% of students reported they now know farmers make good choices to keep the food supply safe. One student commented “I enjoyed doing all the activities, I learned so much!”

Programs At-A-Glance

- Double Up Food Bucks program was launched at Hometown Market in Red Cloud, providing fresh fruits and vegetables to approximately 12 area families.
- Sixteen hours of professional development were offered to six early childhood professionals through the Circle of Security Classroom program.
