York County is #8 in U.S. Corn production. Hailstorms on June 7 and June 14 impacted around 50% of the County's crops, pivots, buildings, homes. Timing was critical for federal crop insurance and corn growth stage. Nebraska Extension worked with ag industry to aid in replant decisions. Two hail damage assessment blog posts resulted in 1393 views (not including newspaper views). Working together, an entire growing season was restarted in two weeks. "Thank you for all the information you've shared on your blog. It's helped me and my crop insurance adjuster make decisions,"- *York Co. Farmer.*

Programs At-A-Glance

- 215 local 9th and 10th graders participated in Connecting the Dots program. 96% of students who participated stated this program helped them explore career and college options.
- The Double up Food Bucks program was started at Enriquez Market. This program is for anyone who receives SNAP benefits, it doubles the amount of fresh produce they can purchase.
