Over 450 age-eligible youth participated in workshops, events, and other educational programming. Through these opportunities youth learned by doing, even if it was learning by distance.

Programs At-A-Glance

- 50% of youth who participated in a weekly Zoom program centered around mental health and social/emotional well-being, regularly attended sessions for three weeks or more.
- Cass Extension Educators write a biweekly column for the local newspaper. Topics range from youth development, agriculture, and specialty crops. Over 1,200 residents subscribe.
