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Nebraska Extension is invested in two vital areas to Colfax County's future; youth and agriculture. For instance, the county's 4-H Youth Crop Scouting team has taken 1st place six years in a row.

The Kudera family always loved plants but didn't know plants would take their son Korbin on a journey to a future career path. Through participation in 4-H and the Nebraska Extension Youth Crop Scouting Contest, Korbin gained skills that helped him pursue an agronomy degree from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. "It has been a great way to find ways to improve the profitability on our farm," Korbin said.

Programs At-A-Glance

- **4-H Grows:** 71% of age-eligible Colfax County youth were reached by 4-H clubs, robotics, school enrichment, workshops, and contests that promote positive youth development.
- **Circuits:** The needs of Colfax teachers are met by creating new lessons. In 2020, students gained knowledge about electricity through activities and explored Snap Circuits!
