One on-farm trial of a highly recommended biological product impacted 80 white corn. Total cost savings by not applying the product was \$1,078,000 or \$13,475 per producer.

Don, an on-farm research trial cooperator who farms north of Lexington, adds encouragement to others. "The Extension service has been awesome. I'd highly encourage farmers to do on-farm research of some type. Either do something you've thought about; come up with a wild, crazy idea, and try it. You never know."

Programs At-A-Glance

- Growing Together Nebraska: A Nutrition Education Program grant for a community garden, in cooperation with the Regional Hospital, provided 3000 people with 2,329 pounds of quality produce.
- N-Field Observation Initiative: In response to the Covid pandemic, ag producers were provided real-time field information through social media with 49,752 views.

9,600 youth were taught at Ag Fest, an ag literacy festival, since it began in 1996.
