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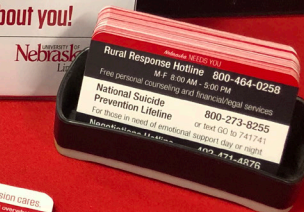

- **Negotiations Program:** Mediation services for agricultural borrowers, creditors, and USDA program participants. Free one-on-one education on agricultural financial and legal matters. **402-471-4876**
- **The Boys Town National Hotline:** Just for boys. For all teens and their parents, this hotline is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, with specially trained counselors. A TDD line is available (1-800-448-1833), allowing counselors to communicate with speech-impaired and deaf callers. **800-448-3000**
- **SAMHSA National Helpline:** Free, confidential, 24/7, 365-day-a-year treatment referral in English and Spanish for individuals and families experiencing issues with alcohol, prescription drug, or other substance abuse. **800-662-HELP (4357)**

Programs At-A-Glance

- **Big Red Ag Growers (BRAG):** 21 members learned about Ag literacy nationwide through in-person/virtual learning. 100% of youth reported learning about various aspects of Ag and telling their Ag story.
- **Learning Child:** A total of 261 hours of on-line professional development was offered for 1487 area Childcare providers and teachers .
