

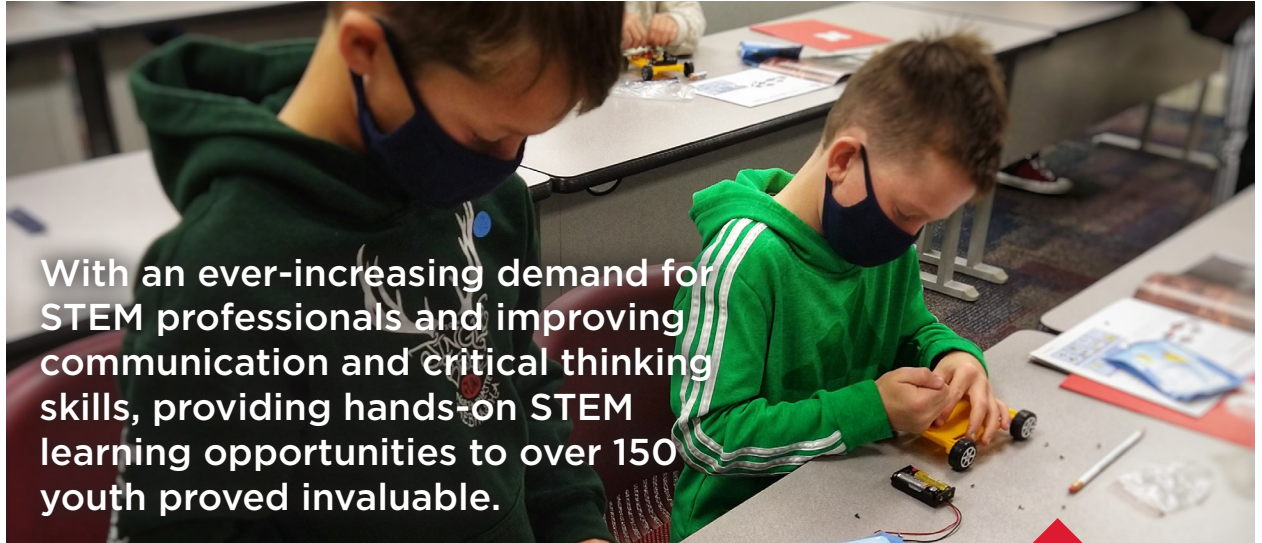

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With an ever-increasing demand for STEM professionals and improving communication and critical thinking skills, providing hands-on STEM learning opportunities to over 150 youth proved invaluable.

Programs At-A-Glance

- **Food Safety Program:** With 47 participants, some 3,995 customers are better protected from acquiring a food-borne illness while going out to eat in West Central Nebraska.
- **Ag Programs:** 74% of attendees to Ag Extension Programs said they would make changes due to what they learned.
