

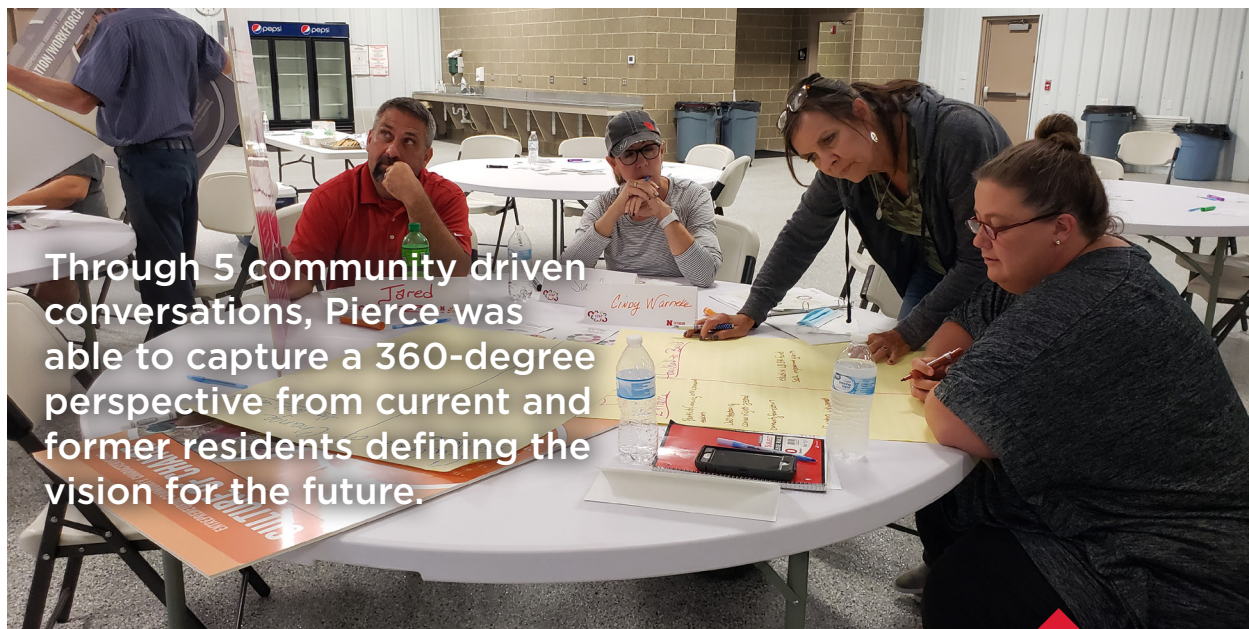

2020 Impact At-A-Glance



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Through 5 community driven conversations, Pierce was able to capture a 360-degree perspective from current and former residents defining the vision for the future.

Because of a partnership with the Pierce Lied Library, Pierce Extension was able to use the Innovation Studio equipment to enhance 4-H workshops by teaching leaders how to use the equipment and who in turn teach 4-Hers. We share and utilize videos and workshops as part of the STEM Summer Reading Program. When the Library wanted to start the “Little Food Pantry”, the Extension staff gathered resources, a container and food to help kick-start the project. Community members, often working together to fill a need, soon filled the container.

Programs At-A-Glance

- 450+ residents responded to the Entrepreneurial Community Activation Process (ECAP) survey to bring forward a definition for the future, craft plans and implement projects.
- The Connected Communities Project, a partnership with Pierce County Economic Development is focused on increasing digital civic engagement in the county’s communities.

63% of youth were reached in 4-H clubs and afterschool via in-person and virtual classes.

\$2,149 was the average savings of people who changed their Medicare Part D drug plan.

78 participants in Multi-cooker classes learned about quick, healthy meals and food safety. 63% used their cookers more after the class was presented.
