Programs At-A-Glance

- 3 virtual workshops including kits were developed and presented that offered 4-H projects youth could follow along with and do in their homes.
- McCook Community for Kids incentivized 10 infant spots, offered one Early Childhood Development Scholarship and helped three providers establish or increase quality care.

80% of participants exhibited the virtual 4-H projects at fair.

10 infant spots were created to help fill the demand for infant care.

120 attended private pesticide training.
