

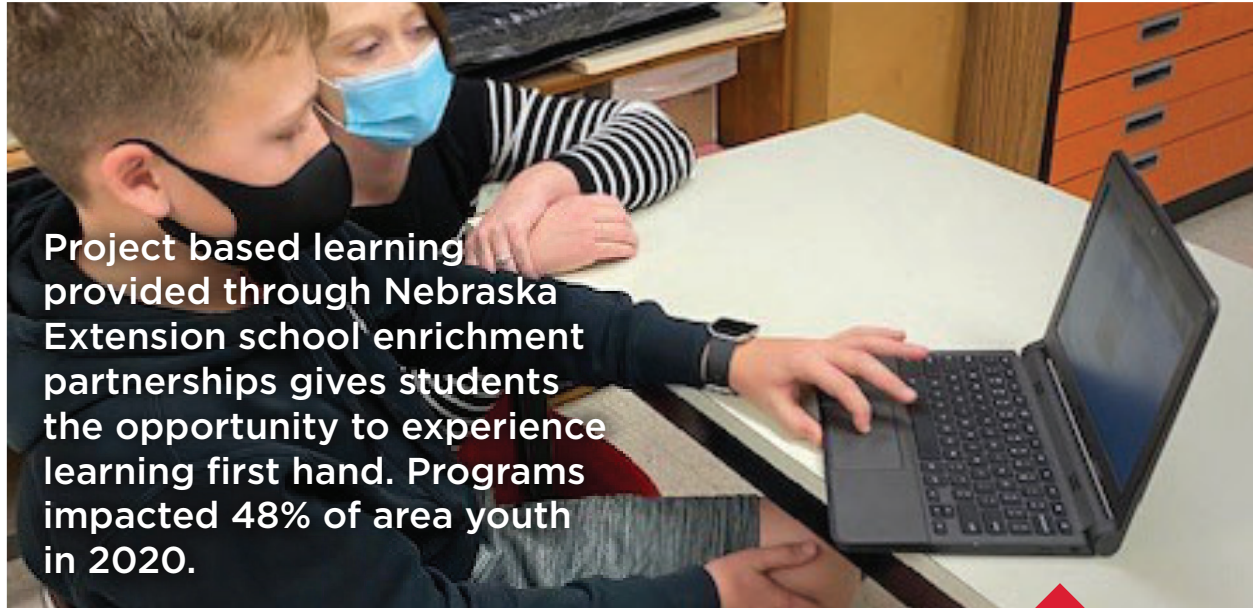

2020 Impact At-A-Glance



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Project based learning provided through Nebraska Extension school enrichment partnerships gives students the opportunity to experience learning first hand. Programs impacted 48% of area youth in 2020.

Vaden enrolled in the NEW year-long agriculture class at his middle school taught by local Extension personnel. Programs At-A-Glance

- 4-H Grows-64% of age eligible youth were reached by clubs, special interest, school enrichment, workshops, and events, all to promote youth development, confidence, and leadership.
- Virtual Programming - 74 youth participated in 10 hours of various hands-on, project based virtual learning opportunities.

270 hours of school enrichment programming impacted students

57 producers in Richardson county were trained as private pesticide applicators

6 on- farm research studies were conducted in Richardson County
