There will be a poster session for the public to see what the students have developed for their business plans. She also mentioned a COAD meeting to be held in Scottsbluff. Jamie updated the board on the Nebraska LEAD program. She recently attended her last LEAD session and told the board what she learned. She will not be traveling with the group when they go overseas in January. She encouraged anyone who is interested in the LEAD program to contact her.

Aaron Berger: No report

<u>Karen DeBoer</u>: Karen gave updates on the open positions in the Cheyenne County office. She mentioned that she and Rob Eirich and Laura Narjes attended the November 20 Cheyenne County Commissioners' meeting. At that meeting, Rob Eirich discussed the 4-H Educator position for Cheyenne and Deuel counties. The University of Nebraska-Lincoln IANR Vice Chancellor approved refilling the position and labeled it Mission Critical which means the hiring

process can move forward soon. Rob is in the process of putting together a search committee and once that is completed, they can move forward.

During the same meeting and after discussion about their concerns with hiring the Assistant without the new 4-H Educator (supervisor) in place, the Commissioners approved the Memorandum of Understanding between Cheyenne County and Deuel County and for the hiring of the 4-H Assistant. Karen indicated that the advertisement for the position has been approved by the Cheyenne County Attorney. Advertising will run in the Sidney Sun-Telegraph and on the KSID webpage and the Cheyenne County Chamber online newsletter. She is checking with Laura to see how she will proceed with advertising in Deuel County.

Karen also explained the progress with the Office Manager/4-H Aide position. There were four applicants for the position and she and Jamie chose two to interview. Interviews are set for Thursday, December 7.

Don Lease indicated he has applied for the Banner County Commissioner opening. He should know by this Thursday if his application was approved. If he is appointed to the board, he will resign from the Extension Board.

Kip and Susan indicated they are willing to help support the 4-H program in Cheyenne County.


