Over 150 youth in Brown, Rock, and Keya-Paha counties got to see a glimpse of what 4-H can offer through "Garden in a Glove" during Nebraska 4-H Month. Garden in a Glove not only is a lesson on seed germination, but it also opens an opportunity for kids to talk about America's food supply. This lesson allows them to explore how plants provide not only food and oxygen for us, but for animals as well. Since germination happens underground, you aren't able to witness the cycle that the plants go through. Through this program, you get to witness the magic that happens from a tiny seed. In order to show the parts of a plant on a larger scale, we started the lesson by dissecting a Lima bean. Most of the kids expressed that they thought the entire seed was how life started, so it was a learning opportunity for them to see that life starts at the embryo.

Caring About Children: Ainsworth Childcare Conference is designed to provide childcare providers with professional development opportunities through partnerships.
