Connecting Entrepreneurial Communities (CEC) is a "walking conference" designed to support rural communities. RPN has hosted this event in different locations across the state for 6 years and brought it to downtown Sidney in May 2024. The 80 attendees included community leaders, volunteers, economic developers, business owners, and members of nonprofit organizations. Sessions were held in local businesses to network and learn new strategies for community and economic development. The conference benefited the local economy as well, with an estimated economic impact to Sidney of \$41,000 over the two days.
