

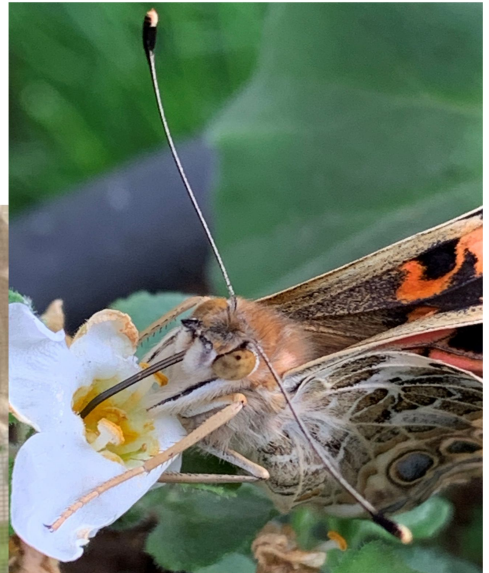

SCHOOL ENRICHMENT-BUTTERFLIES

"Look, look, a butterfly is coming out". Dixon County school enrichment programs support teachers as they connect state school standards in their classrooms with research-based information from UNL. One of the popular school enrichment lessons is based on the life cycle of a butterfly. Elementary students have been able to observe the life cycle changes of a butterfly through four weekly lessons. When students were reading a story about butterflies they were able to point out incorrect vocabulary used by the author such as "cocoon" and "chrysalis".
