Offering hands-on opportunities to deepen youths' understanding of where their food comes from fosters connection, knowledge, and respect for the agricultural world.

Pen to Plate was an intergenerational learning experience designed to help participants gain a deeper understanding of the livestock industry through hands-on learning. This event was a collaboration between the UNL Livestock Judging Team, Great Plains Veterinary Education Center, the Nebraska Beef Council, and Nebraska Extension's Livestock and Meat Educator, Bo Garcia.

Ninety-six percent of participants strongly agreed or agreed that they learned where meat cuts come from in relation to the animal. Additionally, 98% of participants strongly agreed or agreed that, because of this program, they learned something new that they can use now or in the future.
