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The Hamilton County Extension team addressed a community need by organizing a K-6th Grade Homeschool Youth Science Day in response to feedback highlighting limited programming for homeschooled youth.

Homeschool Youth Science Day engaged 118 students from 12 counties in a variety of hands-on STEM activities, including experiments with popcorn, soybean plastic, boba science, circuits, and slime. The event was designed to promote critical thinking and problem-solving skills, earning enthusiastic feedback from participants.
