At Agriculture Safety Day, 5th and 6th grade students learned essential safety skills for agricultural environments. Through collaboration with safety experts, they explored equipment operation, PTO safety, hazard identification, and the dangers of distraction. The event instilled a sense of responsibility in young attendees, emphasizing the importance of safety in preventing injuries by encouraging them to "think of future actions." Seventyeight percent of participants indicated they would be more mindful of safety in their daily lives, helping to foster a generation of safetyconscious agricultural workers.

15 adults attended a Vegetable Gardening Seminar to review best practices and potential problems.

28 individuals received private pesticide applicator certification through UNL water and cropping systems.

Programs At-A-Glance

- Prescribed Fire Seminar: Thirty participants learned how to use fire as a tool for controlling woody encroachment, with 82% stating they now have a better understanding and a new resource outlet.
- 4-H Program Reach:
 360 youth in Harlan County participated in 4-H through five different delivery modes, marking a 16% increase from 2023.
