SAIL participants could attend in person or even via zoom for these classes. The SAIL Program is an evidence-based program developed for adults who are 65 and older. Stay Active & Independent for Life research has shown that you will be stronger, have better balance, feel better, and allow you to stay independent, active and even prevent future falls. All the exercises provided for the participants are done by standing with the support of a chair or sitting and based on individual comfort level. Nebraska Extension is planning to add more SAIL opportunities for the upcoming 2025 calendar year in Lincoln, Logan and McPherson (LLM) Counties.
