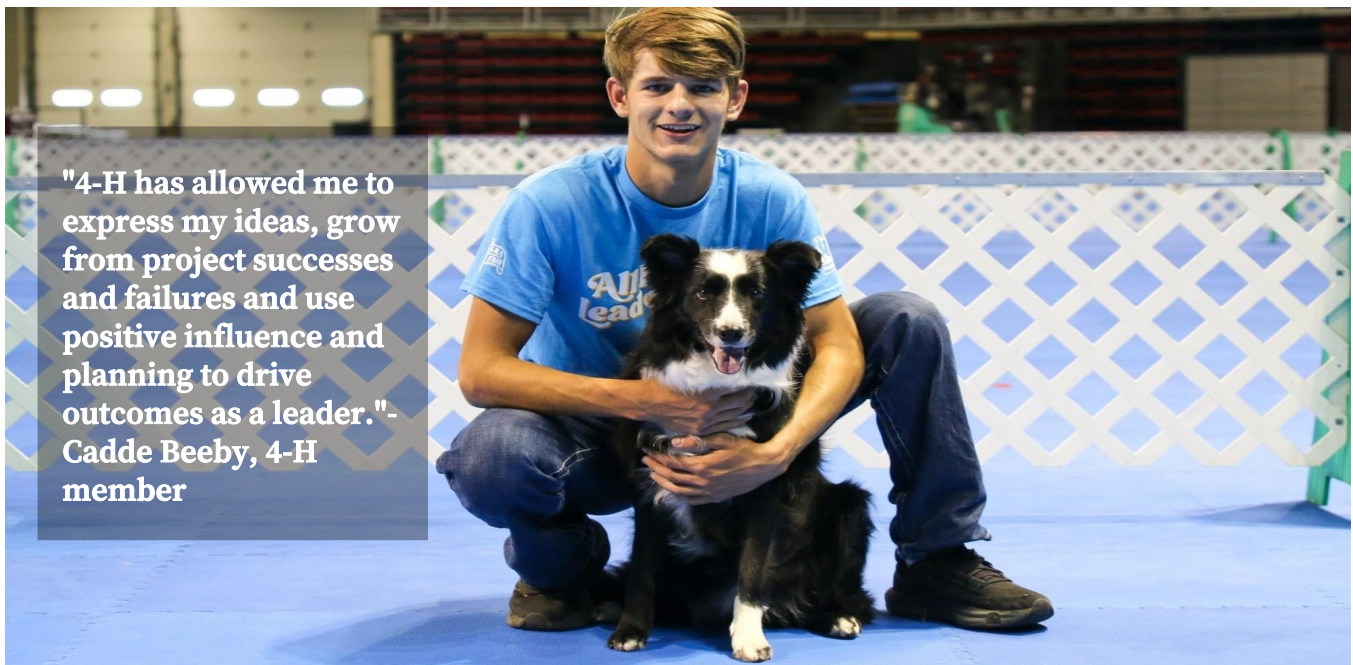


# Red Willow County 2024 Impact At-A-Glance
