## 2025 Impact At-A-Glance

Nebraska Extension's partnerships in Seward County support vitality and quality childhood experiences. A four-year partnership with Communities for Kids saved \$14,496 and indirectly impacted 1,281 children.

Licensed early childhood professionals need 12 hours of annual professional development to operate. Nebraska Extension partnered with Communities for Kids in Seward County to offer 15 free PD programs over four years. Classes covered topics such as artificial intelligence, responding to behaviors, and brain development — awarding 540 PD hours to 60 individuals. Most participants were from Seward County, but 25 individuals traveled to attend these high-value programs. These programs benefit the children cared for by these professionals as 98.5% of all participants planned to use what they learned.
