Returning 4-H members- Please log in using the same username and email as you have in the past.

If you are new to 4-H, begin with the website v2.4honline.com. You will then create a family profile, and proceed to enroll from there. Please save your password, as you will use this in the future to log in as well.

YQCA:

YQCA is required for ALL 4-H aged youth who are going to show livestock at the County or State Fair. This includes Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goats, Poultry, Rabbit, and Dairy exhibitors. You can complete YQCA online! The link to do so is below.

Nebraska Livestock Judging Classic:

29th Annual - Friday, June 13, 2025

The Nebraska Livestock Judging Classic (NLJC) is a regional livestock judging contest for youth. The NLJC is coordinated by Nebraska Extension in Buffalo County and the Nebraska Livestock Judging Classic Committee. The NLJC Committee works to increase the interest of youth in the livestock judging program and the livestock industry including beef, sheep, swine and goats.

More information on registration will be out in the upcoming month.

Livestock Achievement Program:

This is an opportunity for youth enrolled livestock project, and is designed to promote all educational aspects of 4-H livestock projects including selection, production, leadership, and exhibition by recognizing youth striving to improve in their livestock project knowledge and leadership.

The program consists of three levels that require 4-H members to plan and report a broad range of age-appropriate and project-related accomplishments.

Applications/Sign up are due June 15th through the application form link. Plan and Reports, as well as Project Records will be due August 1 via the completion form on the unl website.

Youth completing the achievement program and receiving member of excellence recognition in the various species will be recognized during the Parade of Champions, 4-H weekend at the Nebraska State Fair.

Quilt Paper Piecing Workshop

Learn the basics of piecing a quilt together. Youth will make a quilt block using scrapbooking paper. Project will be eligible to exhibit at this year's county fair! The Workshop will be Monday, April 21st from 1:00-2:30 at the fairgrounds.

Can't attend? Order a Grab and Go Kit to make the quilt pattern at home!

In-person Workshop Cost: \$10.00 Supplies include Cardstock, scrapbooking paper, picture frame and supplies to make another one at home.

Grab and Go Kit Cost: \$5 Supplies include Card stock, scrapbooking paper, and instructions.

Public Speaking and PSA Contest:

Clay County's Public Speaking contest will be held May 19th at 6:00 PM at the Fairgrounds. <u>Please let the extension office know if you plan on participating by May 19th!</u> Current classes and guidelines are based on 4-H age as of January 1.

Clover Kid – under 2 min. in length. Does not need to be about 4-H. Can be speech, poem or story.

Novice - - ages 10 and under - having never competed in a speech contest before, can use a poem or story, under 3 minutes- the Novice division is COUNTY ONLY.

Junior, Intermediate and Senior speeches must be an original speech relating to some aspect of 4-H.

Junior – 4-H age 8-10 (2 - 3 minutes speech length) Intermediate – 4-H age 11- 13 (3-5 minutes speech length) Senior – 4-H age 14-18 (5-8 minutes speech length)

Public Service Announcements (PSA) Contest Rules All Divisions: All PSA's are 60 seconds in length. All PSA's will use the state theme as the basis for their PSA. The 2025 PSA theme "Ready through 4-H.... and beyond" All radio PSA's must promote 4-H and be general enough to be used anywhere in Nebraska at any time of the year. All 4-H PSA's must include the following tag line within the last ten seconds of the PSA: "Learn more about the Nebraska Extension 4-H Youth Development Program at 4h.unl.edu". The tag line is included in the 60 second time limit. Sound effects and public domain music may be used. Copyrighted material may not be used. All PSA's must be the original work of the presenter. Contestants may not use PSA's written and provided by the state or national staff. No team PSA's are allowed. Radio PSA's will be submitted electronically as mp3 format. (No CD's)

**NEW Public Speaking contest for Clay County:

<u>Impromptu Speaking!</u>

This is new for Clay County, and is a current state contest! Please let the Extension Office know by May 9th if you plan to participate!

The Impromptu Speech competition gives youth the opportunity to write and present a speech around a 4-H-related topic that they select during the competition, where they are given 15 minutes to develop and prepare for their presentation. Judges evaluate the subject, organization, and delivery of the speech.

Junior Division (ages 8-10): 1 1/2 minutes Intermediate Division (ages 11-13): 3 minutes Senior Division (ages 14-18): 5 minutes

Only individuals may compete in this class; no team entries are allowed.

On the day of the contest, participants will have a topic randomly selected for them. Youth will have no more than 15 minutes to develop a speech on the selected topic. Participants will then deliver the speech to judges and audience members.

Illustrated Presentation Contest:

The 2025 Clay County Presentation contest will take place on May 19th at the fairgrounds. This contest will take place with our Public Speaking Contest. Please let the Extension office know if you are planning on participating by May 9th. An Illustrated Presentation is a live presentation with a formal talk where youth will use visual aids (such as props, posters, computer-based visuals, handouts, video, etc.) to show and tell others how to do something. The judge views the entire presentation and engages in a question-and-answer session following the presentation.

Individual - Junior Division: 3-5 minutes

Individual - Intermediate and Senior Divisions: 6-8 minutes

Team - Junior Division: 5-7 minutes

Team - Intermediate and Senior Divisions: 8-10 minutes

Participants will be penalized if their presentation exceeds the time limit

An Illustrated Presentation may be given by one (1) individual or a team of two (2) individuals. If team members are not in the same age division, they must compete in the age division of the oldest team member.

All presentation topics should be related to what the 4-H youth is learning through 4-H educational experiences. Presentations should include an introduction (the "why" portion of the topic), a body (the "show and tell" portion of the topic), and a conclusion/summary (the "what" portion of the topic).

Presenters using computer-based visuals may bring files on a USB drive that is PC formatted. Participants may also provide their own computer or other equipment as needed; however, participants must be able to connect their computers to an HDMI cord.

Live animals will not be able to be used in the presentation. Alternative ways of showing information about live animals (models, videos, photos, etc.) are encouraged.

**New Presentation contest for Clay County

Video communication!

This is new for Clay County, and is a current state contest! Please let the Extension Office know by May 9th if you plan to participate!

The video communication contest allows youth to create a multi-media video around a theme related to 4-H. Judges will be evaluating on both the organization of information as well as the audio and video production.

Length: 60-90 seconds

Only individuals may compete in this class; no team entries are allowed.

Youth may use a phone, laptop, or tablet to create a multi-media piece around the 2025 Theme: "Ready through 4-H...and beyond"

Sound effects, public-domain music, and graphics can be used. Copyrighted materials may not be used. Videos will be submitted electronically as MP4 files.

The Nebraska Department of Agriculture (NDA) has opened the application process for high school juniors and seniors interested in attending the Nebraska Agricultural Youth Institute (NAYI). NAYI is one of Nebraska's biggest agriculture youth outreach events. The five-day program brings together students to network with ag leaders, learn more about the industry, and discover careers available in agriculture. NDA helps sponsor and coordinate NAYI every year. This year's theme is "Agriculture: It's in our Genes." NAYI will be held at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln's East Campus July 7–11, 2025. Current high school juniors and seniors interested in attending must apply online at: nda.nebraska.gov/nayi/ All applications must be submitted by the April 15, 2025, deadline. NDA selects students to attend NAYI based on their interest in agriculture, leadership skills and involvement.

Reminder that the official fair dates are July 9-12th. **New this year- Static Judging will take place on Tuesday July 8th!**


