Colfax County 4-H Council College Scholarship

The 4-H Council will be providing \$250 college scholarships for qualifying Colfax County 4-H youth. The scholarship applications have been mailed out to the potential candidates.

Any youth that are planning on applying for the scholarship will need to meet the following requirements and include them on their 4-H resume:

1. The youth needs to be enrolled in a postsecondary institution following high school graduation. This includes 4-year colleges and universities, 2-year community colleges, or trade schools.
2. The youth needs to have shown an animal and/or entered a static exhibit in the Colfax County Fair during the summers following their Junior and Senior year of high school.

3. The youth must meet a minimum of 2 of the following criteria:

- Worked 1 food stand shift in the summers following Junior & Senior year
- Participated in the Holiday Fundraiser both Junior and Senior year
- Contributed to a community service project with their 4-H club as a Junior and Senior
- Attended a minimum of four 4-H Club meetings your Junior and Senior years
- Served as a 4-H Council Member your Junior and Senior year
- Other area of service during Junior and Senior year (Quilt of Valor, Junior Leader, Fair Volunteer, etc.)

Qualifying youth will need to submit the scholarship form, 4-H resume, and copy of their college class schedule to the Extension office by **August 8th**.



Diamond Clover Recognition

Colfax County 4-H'ers can be recognized for all their accomplishments and life skill development through the Diamond Clover Program. This is available to all 4-H'ers, regardless of age. A short form needs to be completed at enrollment and the rest will be completed in September. Club leaders have received 4-H Diamond Clover Recognition Program Information. 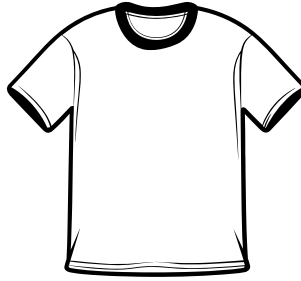
Summer Workshops

2025 Tractor & Equipment Safety Training

The 2025 Tractor & Equipment Safety Training schedule is now available. Federal law restricts youth under 16 from using certain farm equipment unless their parents or guardians own the farm, however 14 and 15 year olds can earn an exemption by completing a two-day certification course. Please see the attached flyer for dates and locations.



2025 T-Shirt Orders

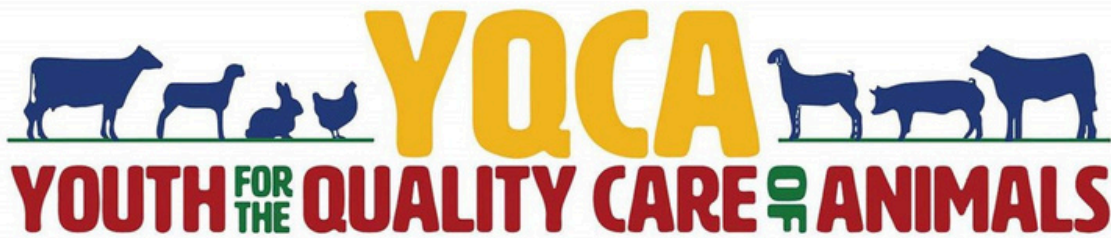

YQCA Training

State 4-H rules require that all 4-H members age 8-18, who are enrolled in the following livestock projects (beef, sheep, dairy, swine, dairy goats, meat goats, poultry, and rabbits) be certified in Youth Quality Care of Animals (YQCA).

Blake Wert in Platte County will be offering Face to Face YQCA training & certification. Blake will be conducting one training session in Colfax County on May 27th at 6:30pm at the Extension Office.

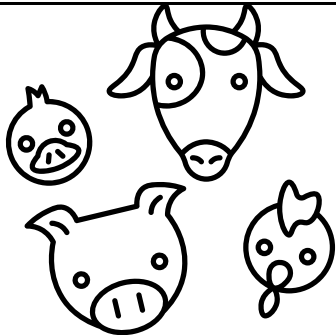

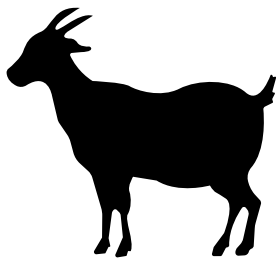


2025 State Fair Livestock Nominations

Show Stock Manager is open for livestock nominations for the 2025 Nebraska State Fair. All livestock in contention to exhibit at the State Fair will be required to complete an online nomination with payment through Show Stock Manager and submit a DNA collector envelope with a hair sample. All 4-H and FFA livestock nominations are due **June 15th, 2025**.

Sheep & Goat Tags & DNA

Market and Breeding sheep and goats will need scrapie tags and DNA samples pulled in order to be shown at the Nebraska State Fair.

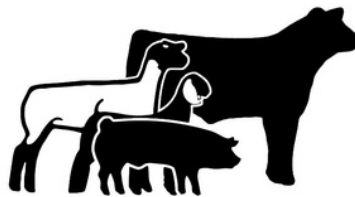
The deadline to have DNA samples to the Extension office is **June 13, 2025**.

County only market sheep and goats will need a scrapie tag to be eligible to show at the Colfax County Fair.



State Fair Tags and DNA Testing

All beef and swine animals to be shown at the 2025 Nebraska State Fair must have an EID tag installed and hair pulled for DNA samples. Registered breeding beef will continue to use a tattoo. EID tags will cost \$3.75 and DNA testing costs \$7.00 per animal. Contact the office to get animals tagged and the hair samples pulled.



Livestock Progress Shows Mailing List

All livestock exhibitors are encouraged to attend a Progress Show prior to the County Fair. This serves as good practice for both the exhibitor and their animals.

Contact the Extension office if you want to be on the mailing list for 4-H Livestock Progress Shows and specify which animal(s) you are interested in. The information about Progress Shows will be sent only to those who request it. We do not carry names over from last year's list, so if you want to receive progress show information you must request it every year.

2025 TRACTOR & EQUIPMENT SAFETY TRAINING

MARK YOUR CALENDAR! COST: \$60

Federal law restricts youth under 16 from using certain farm equipment unless their parents or guardians own the farm. However, 14- and 15-year-olds can earn an exemption by completing a two-day certification course, which includes a written test and a driving exam. Successful completion grants NSTMOP certification, allowing them to operate tractors and certain mechanized equipment on farms and ranches, and obtain a husbandry permit.

Youth under 14 years of age can attend Day 1 if accompanied by an adult but cannot drive equipment, attend Day 2, or become certified. Students under 14 must register but won't be charged a fee.

Family Responsibilities:

1. Exhibitors will be required to enroll in 4-H by the June 15 statewide enrollment deadline.
2. Exhibitors will review their species fairbooks.
3. Exhibitors showing market and/or breeding beef, feeder calves, market and/or breeding swine, market and/or breeding sheep or market and/or breeding goats at State Fair must have a signed and sealed official DNA envelope with hair samples for DNA verification. **Every animal nomination (this includes all breeding animals and feeder calves) will require a DNA submission.** DNA must be turned into their county office and have completed the online nomination with payment in *Show Stock Manager* by June 15. Any animal carrying an 840 EID tag will require the exhibitor to obtain a Premises ID. Contact the local Extension Office for details. (It is recommended that you make a copy or a photo image of the completed envelope you turn into your county.)
4. Exhibitors will be required to complete Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) certificate by August 10.
5. Exhibitors will confirm that the ear tattoo and/or identification tag matches the animal nomination submitted by June 15 for confirmation of legibility and/or accuracy.
6. Exhibitors will notify the County Extension Staff of any retags that may occur up to time of check-in at the State Fair.
7. Exhibitors will select which animal nominations they have chosen to show at State Fair on the State Fair entry website by August 10. All nominated and validated animals will be automatically listed as a choice option for entry registration.
8. Exhibitors will be required to bring the breed registration association paperwork to check-in at State Fair for animals wanting to show in a breed class. **The registration papers must show the exhibitor's name or a co-owner who is an immediate member of the exhibitor's family and is listed with the online nomination in Show Stock Manager. Family farm or ranch names will not be accepted.**

County Staff Responsibilities:

1. Submit an 840 EID tag order for beef and swine animal projects.
2. Schedule and publish weigh-in and/or tagging dates if offered in your county.
3. Request, distribute and collect DNA collectors for families. 840 EID tags should not be distributed without the premise ID being recorded in 4H Online. It is optional but recommended to record on the DNA envelope.
4. Inform families of the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) training options available to them (in person and online).
5. Collect all beef, swine, lamb, and goat DNA envelopes by June 15. Families will submit payment online in *Show Stock Manager*. Copy all DNA envelopes for your county records and mail all completed DNA envelopes to the Aksarben Stock Show office by **June 20**.
6. Remind families to confirm that the ear tattoo and/or identification tag matches the animal nomination submitted by June 15 for confirmation of legibility and/or accuracy.
7. Collect Premises ID numbers from exhibitors and input those into 4H Online.
8. Review and validate all online livestock nominations in *Show Stock Manager* for each exhibitor by **July 1**.
9. Input nomination edits in to Show Stock Manager for your families. Edits will be corrected by the Show Coordinator. For retags, directly notify Brandy Schulze bschulze@unl.edu and/or input the change in *Show Stock Manager*.
10. Inform families that all nominations have been validated and are available for entry at the Nebraska State Fair entry website <https://www.statefair.org/> when the system is open.

Additional Information

- County offices can accept paper ID sheets for their own record keeping but these **will not be accepted as a form of identification for State Fair.**
- There are entry limits for each of the individual species. Exhibitors cannot exhibit more than the following for each species to State Fair: Beef (5), Swine (6), Sheep (4), Goat (4), Poultry (6), Rabbit (6).
