# 4-H Leader and Volunteer Screening

 All volunteers and staff who work directly with youth were required to complete the Nebraska 4-H volunteer screening process which will take approximately 5-10 minutes. Thank you for completing this process. If you haven't completed it yet, please do this as soon as possible. Volunteer screening is done to assure a safe. positive, and nurturing environment for all youth involved with the Nebraska 4-H programs and provide protection for the child, the volunteer, the educator, the 4-H Council, the Extension Board, and the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Extension. Please note that direct volunteers are responsible for covering the screening fee. Currently, the cost of the screening is \$16.00 (this is NEW this year due to a new program which checks National and State Registry). This fee must be paid at the time of screening and re-screening through 4-HOnline.

The 2025 Special Garden Project will focus on the Goldie Husk Cherry. This old-fashioned fruit from the tomato family has sweet berries inside golden husks. The fruits have many uses and can be eaten raw, dried, frozen, canned, or made into tasty treats like pies, desserts, or preserves. (I assure you the husk cherry is different than a groundcherry, which is a weed in Nebraska, that looks very similar, but isn't edible)

# State Fair Requirements



4-Hers who plan to exhibit at the 2025 Nebraska State Fair and/or the Aksarben Stock Show will be required to complete an online nomination with payment through Show Stock Manager at https://showstockmgr.com/ and submit a DNA collector envelope with hair sample. This includes all 4-H and FFA breeding livestock, market livestock and feeder calves. Each nomination will be \$7.00 per animal. NOTE: this does not automatically enter the animal or exhibitor for the Nebraska State Fair. The exhibitor must still complete the separate online State Fair entry process.

DNA envelopes can be picked up at the extension office. Deadline is June 15.

# YQCA - Youth for the Quality Care of Animals

Quality Assurance will be offered through the program YQCA, Youth for the Quality Care of Animals again this year - Deadline to complete is June 1, 2025.

Registering for QA will be online at https://yqca.learngrow.io using the Family 4-H Online login information for active youth. If you are in both 4-H and FFA, please register through the 4-H login. Be sure you select the 2025 training dates. Face-to-face sessions (1 hour) cost \$3 and online sessions cost \$12. There is a test out option online for ages 12 & 15 for \$36. Whether you are completing online or face-to-face certification all registrations and payments must be completed online prior to completion. Refunds can not be given if you cannot make the face-to-face session.

\*\*There is a PRE and POST 'test' in YQCA to complete PRIOR to the office marking youth COMPLETE!

Species include: dairy cattle, beef cattle, pigs, sheep, goats, market rabbits, and poultry.
