4-H Online Enrollment Due 6/15

Steps to enroll in 4-H:

1. ENROLL on 4honline - https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in
Enrollment will look a little different depending on if you're a new 4-H member or if you're a returning 4-H member. You can not step by step instructions at https://4h.unl.edu/enroll



2. PAY FEES TO EXTENSION OFFICE TO BECOME ACTIVE Ages 5-7 as of Jan 1st 2024- FREE Ages 8-18 as of Jan 1st 2024- \$3.00 (office only accepts check or cash)

*Note - completing only ONE of these steps does not make a 4-H age youth active in 4-H. To be active, 4-H age youth have to complete BOTH 4-HOnline and pay enrollment dues.

Project Enrollment

Starting in the 2023-2024 program year, project selection is now optional. By successfully completing the 4-H member enrollment by the June 15th deadline, youth will be eligible to participate and exhibit in any project area, contest, county and state fairs. While project selection is optional, it is encouraged for youth to select projects they are interested in exploring. Please note:

- o Youth are only eligible to exhibit in a project area or contest in a single county.
- o Horse and shooting sports projects will continue to require project enrollment due to the parental consent required to participate in these projects.

***You should receive an email saying "Your enrollment has been approved, however payment is required" once you submit your enrollment. If you do not receive this email, your enrollment is NOT complete. There is a lot of clicking at the end- keep clicking ③ Once we receive your payment, you will receive another confirmation email.

YQCA Certification- Due 6/15!

If youth ages 8-18 as of Jan 1 are showing beef, pigs, sheep or goats (this includes breeding, bucket calves and feeder calves), dairy cattle, dairy goats, poultry and/or rabbits at County fair, state fair, AKSARBEN or other shows, they need to complete the YQCA Certification.

There are 3 ways to complete this certification:

- 1. Youth can complete an online course. This course has 3 sections and youth must complete a quiz in each of the sections and pass with an 80% or better. If youth do not get at least an 80% they are locked out for an hour and should review material. This course also has a fee of \$12 that must be paid online.
- 2. Youth can attend an Instructor Led Session put on by the Extension Office. Youth will attend inperson and actively participate through the 60 minute PowerPoint, as well as some hands on activities at the end. This session has a fee of \$3 that must be paid online through the YQCA Website. We also ask that you pre-register through the YQCA website so we can make we have enough supplies for the hands on activities.
- 3. Youth could complete the Test Out option online at the Intermediate or Senior Level. These courses cost \$36 & \$48 respectively.

Deadline to complete YQCA is June 15th! YQCA Certificates need to be sent (<u>kmunger2@unl.edu</u>) or turned in to the office.

Once youth have attended their YQCA in-person test, there's a short, survey-like "post test" they will need to complete in order to print their certificate.

*New in 2022 - Companion Animals and Exotic Animals are required to turn in Animal Affidavits!

*Pig 4-H'ers - You are required to submit pictures of your 4-H tags in your pigs ears. Read the Fairbook for full details!

State Fair Nominations - Due 6/15!

State Fair Livestock must be nominated at https://showstockmgr.com/ before June 15th. Step-by-Step instructions can be found below. All resources including the State Fair 4-H schedule can be found here: https://4h.unl.edu/state-fair

All livestock in contention to exhibit at the Nebraska State Fair will be required to submit a DNA nomination. This includes all 4-H and FFA breeding livestock, market livestock, and feeder calves. Any DNA nomination submitted through Show Stock Manager will also be eligible for exhibition at the Aksarben Stock Show. All animals will automatically be eligible for both breeding and marketno additional fees or double payments will be required.

<u>H/Fair_Info/Dawes%20County%20Ag%20Society%20County%20Fair%20Camper%20Guidelines_Signed%202023.pdf</u> The Ag Society only has **7** available hookups this year. Interest in 1 of the **7** camper hookups is due by July 1st. A drawing will be completed after July 1st.

Families interested in obtaining a camper spot must call or inform the Dawes County Extension Office by July 1st of the current year. When calling the Extension Office, please share name and phone number. The Dawes County Ag Society is asking families to only call if you live 15+ miles away from the Fairgrounds. The Dawes County Extension Office will confirm that families live 15+ miles away from the Fairgrounds. After July 1st, the Dawes County Extension Office will put all names into a drawing. The first seven families drawn will receive a camper hookup spot. Families will receive a phone call if they receive a spot.

The fee for the camper hookup spot will be \$25 per day. If you receive a camper hookup, you are expected to stay the entire week. Keep in mind if a camper is put in place weeks before the county fair, families will be charged \$25 for each day. Families will have to pay before getting the box unlocked. The Dawes County 4-H Assistant, Kylin, will handle the unlocking. You may call her at the Extension Office (308)432-3373 to set up a time.

Checks are payable to the Dawes County Agricultural Society. Please understand that the Dawes County Ag Society and Dawes County Extension Office are trying to make the camper spot process fair and organized for everyone.



7SG Loans for 4-H Members

The Farm Service Agency (FSA) makes loans to youth to establish and operate agricultural income-producing projects in connection with 4-H clubs, FFA and other agricultural groups. Projects must be planned and operated with the help of the organization advisor, produce sufficient

income to repay the loan and provide the youth with practical business and educational experience. The maximum loan amount is \$5,000.

Youth Loan Eligibility Requirements:

- 1) Be a citizen of the United States (which includes Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands) or a legal resident alien
- 2) Be 10 years to 20 years of age
- 3) Comply with FSA's general eligibility requirements
- 4) Conduct a modest income-producing project in a supervised program of work as outlined above
- 5) Demonstrate capability of planning, managing and operating the project under guidance and assistance from a project advisor. The project supervisor must recommend the youth loan applicant, along with providing adequate supervision.
