Minutes from Plant Fair and Monthly Meeting

MINUTES FROM MONTHLY MEETING

MAY 17, 2025

Kathy Duval called the meeting to order. Minutes from the April 12th meeting were accepted, Wendy Winstead made the motion and Laurie Larson, the second.

OLD BUSINESS

Connie Dvorak reported the the checking account balance ie \$12,270 less \$185 which is outstanding as of today. All bills have been paid and deposits made from the Plant Fair, April 25 & 26. Net plant fair income is \$3,081.21.

Robin Jones asked about the cost of postcards so she can make correct entries in the marketing budget. Vickie Rundell fielded her questions. There is the cost of the postcards themselves, the cost of the printing and the cost of postage, not a simple matter.

We did pay a restock fee to Bluebird Nursery. We sold most of the plants we received, returning 34%. It was noted that we received less plants to sell this year and sold out of some of the popular perennials early.

Pam Foltz reminded us to return green aprons and yard signs.

We had fun talking about the plant fair. Appreciation and gratitude was expressed to Linda Douglas for an outstanding job managing the food. She suggested next year less people should bake bars and instead donate \$10. She brought leftover desserts to eat with our pizza. Viola McShannon and staff with their creative ideas had great success in the Children's Corner. They ran out of supplies on Saturday serving both kids and interested adults. Carol Poellot talked about her positive conversations with vendors as she walked around in her bumblebee costume. Kurt Schrant brought up the shortcomings revealed by the surveys. We had a good discussion and considered adjustments that could help.

Connie Dvorak noted hanging baskets didn't sell well. Discussion focused on their price. She also noted that this year we made an additional \$800 on vendor fees which is attributed entirely to the extra work by Pam Foltz.

Vicki Rundell anchored the Welcome Table. She reported 59 towns were represented by people filling out cards and 4 from out of state. This was another successful aspect of our plant fair. Other Kudos went out to Pam Foltz for the posters she designed and printed. There was appreciation expressed for Mary Lux and Wendy Winstead advertising our event across the state. Brian Mandl noted the potluck ran low on food this year. He had good locations for banners and the question was asked if we needed more. Although the Blue Light is missing the remote, Trent Brussen made it work and felt there was no need to replace it when asked.

On a different subject, Viola McShannon attended a scholarship luncheon at Northeast Community College. Although she did not meet the recipient of our horticulture scholarship, she knows his name. There is a future opportunity to meet and encourage him in his studies or ask him to visit us.

NEW BUSINESS



The second event is a Flower Tour 5:00 Thursday, July 10th in Wayne. We will visit Fresh Flowers by Lauren, a private garden, and Deb Daehnke's gardens. Deb emphasized that the Wayne flower tour is still in planning stages.

There were several suggestions or favorite places suggested for next year: Ausborn Tree Nut Grove in Yankton, Prairie Pedlar Gardens in Odebolt, IA, Bloomers in South Sioux City, Harmony Nursery and Daylily Farm in Bradshaw, Green Paws Nursery in Silver Creek.

Robin Jones moved to adjourn the May meeting, Joyce Eucker seconded the motion. Our next meeting is September 13th.

→ DID YOU KNOW

Did You Know that Extension Missouri Valley Master Gardeners in Yankton, South Dakota offer a garden tour every summer as a fund raiser for their organization. They plan to hold the 2025 garden tour on June 28. More details will follow from them but in past years about five gardens were scheduled to view in Yankton. These gardens ranged from small backyard gardens to large gardens with swimming pools and outside TV’s overlooking the Missouri River. I’ve gone to many of their tours and have never been disappointed. Often, new plants caught my attention that I then tried in my own garden.

The time frame is usually from 9-noon, with a salad luncheon following the tour. Prior to the start of the tour they have plants for sale, some of which come from Diane’s Greenhouse. Price is usually \$10-\$15 for the tour, which I think is a great deal for both a tour and lunch. Do keep in mind that their itinerary might change.

If you’d like a relaxing time to view beautiful gardens, keep their tour in mind. It’s nice education while we help another Master Gardener group fulfill their goals.
