Junior-1 to 3 min.

Intermediate- 3 to 5 min. Senior- 5 to 8 min.

- Speeches must be original and include 4-H as the major component.

 (EXCEPTION: Clover Kids)
- · Use of visual aids and props are not allowed

Illustrated Presentation:

- Length of speeches: <u>Clover Kid</u>- Under 2 min. <u>Individual</u>- 6 to 8 min. <u>Team</u>- 8 to 10 min.
- All presentation topics should be related to what the 4-H youth is learning through 4-H educational experiences
- An illustrated presentation may be given by one individual or a team of two individuals. If team members are not in the same age division, they must compete in the age division of the oldest team member.
- · Use of visual aids and props are allowed

Public Service Announcements:

**Youth must be currently enrolled in 4-H to participate

in the North Panhandle Public Speaking Contest**

- · Length of PSA's: 60 Seconds
- PSA's must be original and follow the theme.
 For 2024, the theme is "4-H is a Feeling"
 - All PSA's must promote 4-H and be general enough to be used anywhere in Nebraska at any time of the year
 - All PSA's must include the following tag line within the last 10 seconds: "Learn more about Nebraska Extension 4-H Youth Development at 4hunledu"
 - Sound effects and public domain music may be used. Copyrighted material may not be used.

Nebraska 4-H requires all youth enrolled in livestock projects to complete annual quality assurance training through <u>Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA)</u>.

Youth enrolled in any of following projects or project areas will need to complete YQCA training;

- **Beef** (bucket calf, feeder calf, breeding beef, market beef)
- Dairy Cattle
- Goat (breeding meat goat, dairy goat, meat goat)
- Poultry
- Rabbit
- Sheep (breeding sheep, market sheep)
- **Swine** (breeding swine, market swine)

There are 3 options to complete the YQCA requirements;

- Web-Based Training (costs \$12 per individual regardless of age)
- Face-to-Face Training (costs \$3 per individual regardless of age)
- Testing Out (Intermediate -\$36, Seniors-\$48, not an option for juniors)

Test-out options are only available to youth in the first year of Intermediate (age 12) and Senior (age 15) age levels.

<u>In Dawes County, ALL youth wanting to show livestock at the county fair must complete YQCA by</u>
<u>June 15</u>

Project Enrollment

Starting in the 2023-2024 program year, project selection is now optional. By successfully completing the 4-H member enrollment by the June 15th deadline, youth will be eligible to participate and exhibit in any project area, contest, county and state fairs. While project selection is optional, it is encouraged for youth to select projects they are interested in exploring. Please note:

- o Youth are only eligible to exhibit in a project area or contest in a single county.
- o **Horse and shooting sports projects** will continue to require project enrollment due to the parental consent required to participate in these projects.

PREEC Scholarship

The University of Nebraska – Lincoln Panhandle Research, Extension and Education Center will again offer the "Panhandle Research, Extension and Education Center Student Scholarship." Two scholarships of \$1000 each will be awarded. The application period will be open from March 1 to April 15, 2024.

Along with filling out the online form a letter of recommendation must also be submitted and emailed to dmccarthy2@unl.edu. The email subject line should be "2024 Scholarship Recommendation Letter (Insert Name of Student)." The application will be considered incomplete without the letter. Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Have attended high school in the Panhandle of Nebraska in one of the following counties:
 - Banner, Blaine, Box Butte, Cherry, Cheyenne, Dawes, Deuel, Garden, Grant, Hooker, Kimball, Morrill, Scotts Bluff, Sheridan, Sioux, and Thomas
- Be attending any of the Nebraska University Campuses, including Nebraska College of Technical Agriculture.
- Majoring in Agronomy, Ag Economics, Animal Science, Vet Science, Agriculture Technology, or a related degree emphasizing agriculture.
- Be a graduating high school senior or in the first or second year of study.

Awards will be chosen by May 1, and applicants will be notified via email if selected.

Summer 2024 Workshops


We are working on finalizing summer events for 2024! Be on the lookout in April for a finalized brochure!

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
