The 4-H Story is required to earn your 4-H member year recognition. The story is due in the Extension Office by September 29.

Exhibitors for static exhibits should have received instructions in the mail as to when exhibits must be brought to the Extension Office. If you have any questions about the process, please feel free to call the Extension Office.

For **Livestock entries**, August 10, 8:00 pm, is the deadline to enter State Fair Entries in ShoWorks online at <https://nebr.fairwire.com/> (beef, swine, sheep, goats, poultry, rabbits). All non-livestock **contest entries** (Fashion Show, Robotics Showcase, Contests, and Presentations) must also be entered online at the same site by 8:00 pm CDT on August 10. The website will shut down at that time, so no late entries will be possible. These items should be entered into the website by the exhibitor.

CONTESTS AT THE NEBRASKA STATE FAIR

If you are interested in competing in contests at the State Fair, there are two new contests available!

- When: Saturday, August 26, 2023 at 7:00 p.m.
- Where: Five Points Bank Arena
- Who: 4-H exhibitors with eligible 4-H livestock entries at the 2023 Nebraska State Fair

Registration:

- Deadline: Thursday, August 10 at 8:00 p.m.
- Fee: \$30 per team
- Cap: 20 teams per species
- Note: Registration must be completed by local Extension offices.

The contests will be open to the first 20 registered teams for each species. Teams will be registered through their local Extension office through an online form. All teams must consist of exhibitors with eligible 4-H livestock entries at the 2023 Nebraska State Fair.

Goat Fitting Contest

Each team must be comprised of the following:

- Each team member must be from the same or adjacent county to complete a team.
- Each team must be comprised of two members.
- Each team must have at least one member 13 and under (Intermediate division at the Nebraska State Fair).
- One team member must provide the animal used in the contest. The other team member is not required to be goat exhibitor.

Beef Fitting Contest

Each team must be comprised of the following regulations:

- Each team member must be from the same or adjacent county to complete a team.
- Each team must be comprised of three members with at least one member 13 and under.

The 2023 Nebraska 4-H Foundation Annual Charity Shoot will be held Thursday, September 28, 2023, at the Oak Creek Shooting Club, 2890 West Road, Brainard, NE 68626.

THE IMPACT

Nebraska 4-H Foundation sponsors and participants support the programs of Nebraska 4-H. The funds raised from this event will benefit Nebraska 4-H Shooting Sports, speech and public speaking, teen and adult leadership education, volunteer programs, member recognition, project clinics, camps, counselor training, livestock and non-livestock events, and much more.

THE EVENT

This event entails 80 sporting clay targets at 15 automated fields, with re-entry allowed. Shells are provided as part of the registration fees. There will be a shotgun start, and all NSCA rules apply. Ear and eye protection are required. Golf carts will be available to rent for an additional fee.

Participants will receive lunch prior to starting.

At the conclusion of the tournament, a meal will be provided with an auction to follow.

Discussion for next year as to keep doing the Tractor/ATV contest because of low entries. B. Maricle reported that Shooting Sports competitions went smoothly. There was also a Horse Clinic the week before that had several youth participate in.

2. **Fund Raising** – Stokes, Staub and B. Brengelman reported the shirts made by Loco's for our fundraiser may be purchased on Facebook.

- Big Screen for Premium Sale – will use the big screen again to picture the exhibitor with their animal selling. Jessica from Cornhusker Power will be present for the photos also.
